
2011 - 2012 Pudong Hebrew School Curriculum

All classes begin their day with prayers, and learn about all the Jewish holidays.

Preschool: Ages 2 - 4

Shabbat in a Box

Children will get excited about their heritage as they learn all the Jewish holidays through creative hands on activities. They will create a Shabbat Box and Havdalah set to take home, combining lessons, stories and songs.

Aleph Bet Train

Students are introduced to the first 10 letters of the aleph bet, through games and hands on activities. The children learn and bring home a letter to add to their Aleph Bet Train.

Kindergarten - 1st Grade

Jewish History

The children are introduced to Torah (Bible) through an understanding of the storyline. The Biblical narrative is taught as the students sit around a story mat, using 3-D Bible characters to bring the information to life. A creative scrapbook is designed weekly.

Hebrew Vowels

The letters are reviewed and the vowels are introduced. Students should be familiar (but not necessarily fluent) with all the letters and vowels by the end of the year. Reading teachers work privately with each student for 8 minutes a day (during class time.) Students also start learning Hebrew writing.

Honor Your Elders

Students follow 2 young children, Rivky and Eli as they journey in the path of good character traits. They work on an activity book as they follow the story line.

2nd - 6th Grade

Our Israel

Israel the past and present- The children will connect to the land and Israel. They will create a beautiful wall hanging depicting the different cities in Israel.

Aleph Champ:

A color-coded reading system where each child starts from the Alef Bet and progresses as fast as they can. Reading teachers work privately with each student for 10 minutes a day (during class time.) Students also start learning Hebrew writing as they are progressing with their reading.
